Wayne County's Comprehensive Plan identifies long-term goals including:

- Conservation of farmland and protection of natural resources
- Preservation Wayne County's historic farm-based culture and rural character
- Supporting agriculture, agribusiness, travel, and tourism
- Enhancing the quality of life for those who live and work in the County

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners looks to further these efforts by participating in programs like the Ohio Department of Agriculture's (ODA) Clean Ohio Local Agricultural Easement Purchase Program, or LAEPP.

As a Local Sponsor to the LAEPP, the Wayne County Commissioners assist the ODA in finding interested and eligible farms in our area and helps the landowner complete the application process. If selected for funding, the landowner can receive up to \$2000 per acre - not to exceed our 2024 allocation of \$81,108 - from the ODA in exchange for placing a permanent agricultural easement on their land.

## This is a competitive program with several steps involved:

- If you are interested in being considered, please complete and submit the attached Questionnaire to the Wayne County Planning Department no later than March 1, 2024.
- The Planning Department will work with eligible landowners to complete the online application which is due in April. This process will assign a point value to each application based on criteria from the ODA.
- > The top scoring properties will have their final applications submitted to the ODA in May.
- > Once selected for funding by the ODA it may take an additional 1-2 years to finalize and close.
- Payments to landowners will be made at closing with closing costs deducted from the final purchase price.

Please note: Eligible properties must be at least 40 acres or touching another permanently preserved property.

Placing an easement on a farm is a major commitment that will affect how the land can be used <u>FOREVER</u>. This questionnaire will help you gain understanding of the steps involved in the process. Anyone considering this option should look into possible family, legal, and tax implications <u>prior</u> to applying.

Because this year's allocation (\$81,108) is lower than usual, we will be looking for very special properties to best use our available funds!
